Beyond the marvels of science in the 21st century comes the clarion voice of a man after God's own heart, David. As the Holy Spirit spoke with clarity to him, he penned the words of what became the 139th Psalm. May we hear its peaceful but powerful message in the midst of an age that constantly shouts at us for attention.

- 7 Is there anyplace I can go to avoid your Spirit? to be out of your sight? 8 If I climb to the sky, you're there! If I go underground, you're there! 9 If I flew on morning's wings to the far western horizon, 10 You'd find me in a minute— you're already there waiting! 11 Then I said to myself, "Oh, he even sees me in the dark! At night I'm immersed in the light!" (7-11,MSG)
- Oh yes, you shaped me first inside, then out; you formed me in my mother's womb. 14 I thank you, High God-you're breathtaking! Body and soul, I am marvelously made! I worship in adoration—what a creation! 15 You know me inside and out, you know every bone in my body; You know exactly how I was made, bit by bit, how I was sculpted from nothing into something. 16 Like an open book, you watched me grow from conception to birth; all the stages of my life were spread out before you, The days of my life all prepared before I'd even lived one day. (13-16 MSG) / Cf.: My frame was not hidden from You when I was being formed in secret [and] intricately and curiously wrought [as if embroidered with various colors] in the depths of the earth [a region of darkness and mystery]. (15 AMP) . . . the wonderful composition of the human body, the various implication of veins, arteries, fibres, membranes, and the 'inexplicable texture' of the whole frame. "Some think," says Dr. Dodd, "that the allusion to embroidery is still carried on. As the embroiderer has still his work, pattern, or carton, before him, to which he always recurs; so, by a method as exact, revere all my members in continuance fashioned, i. e., from the rude embryo or mass they daily received some degree of figuration; as from the rude skeins of variously coloured silk or worsted, under the artificer's hands, there at length arises an unexpected beauty, and an accurate harmony of colours and proportions."—Adam Clarke's Commentary

Heart Beats

I will praise You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made; Marvelous are Your works, And that my soul knows very well. (Psalms 139:14, NKJV)

With your arm bent at the elbow hold your hand in front of you. Now make a fist. That is the approximate size of your heart!

I don't remember the countdown before I became enshrouded in oblivion. Using portions of my body the surgeon skillfully added new avenues of passage for the flow of my blood . . . well, not all my blood. The quadruple bypass now completed, all that remained were the days and hours of recuperation.

Written over three thousand years ago are these words: "For the life of the flesh is in the blood, . . "Lev 17:11 (NKJV). These literal words of the Bible are used repeatedly in a figurative sense to convey to us the spiritual realities of our relationship with God. The literal basis for this is so exciting in itself that as we contemplate it our spirits praise God with the psalmist: "Thank you for making me so wonderfully complex! Your workmanship is marvelous—how well I know it. You watched me as I was being formed in utter seclusion, as I was woven together in the dark of the womb" (Psalms 139:14-15, NLT).

With the same wonder and awe, we examine our personal spiritual life:

- •Wisdom speaks: "My son, pay attention to what I say; listen closely to my words. Do not let them out of your sight, keep them within your heart; for they are life to those who find them and health to a man's whole body. Above all else, guard your heart, for it is the wellspring of life" (Prov 4:20-23, NIV). Even spiritual attentiveness results in physical benefits.
- •A frequent side effect of bypass surgery is fibrillation of the heart—a muscular twitching involving individual muscle fibers acting without coordination. This experience leaves one depleted and lackadaisical. On the spiritual side we have Christ's words: "Do not let your hearts be troubled (distressed, agitated) . . . " (John 14:1, AMP).
- •In Scripture, "heart" is frequently used in the sense of one's emotional and psychological essence. René Descartes describes six primary emotions: admiration, love, hate, desire, joy and sadness. Paul, in Philippians, encourages us to pray with this objective: "and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus" (Phil 4:7, NKJV).

The throbbing organ in our chest testifies to the skill and wisdom of our Creator. It is vital to life. And Scripture shows us how vital the spiritual lessons are to our eternal welfare.

Father, you hold our beating hearts in your hands. You are the Master Surgeon, whose Son has said, "And I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; neither shall anyone snatch them out of My hand. My Father, who has given them to Me, is greater than all: and no one is able to snatch them out of My Father's hand" (John 10:28-29, NKJV). We trust you to keep us in your Eternal Care. Amen.




