"So much so you just kept taking more wives!" Lightning struck a tree nearby.

Defensive now, Solomon said, "But I warned the young, who are full of vitality, to not spend their energy foolishly: 'O my son, be wise and stay in God's paths; don't carouse with drunkards and gluttons, Listen to your father's advice and don't despise an old mother's experience. . . . O my son, trust my advice—stay away from prostitutes. . . . ' (Prv. 23:19-22, 26, LB) 'You're addicted to thrills? What an empty life! The pursuit of pleasure is never satisfied.' (Prv. 21:17, Msg)"

"Had you listened to your own advice, Solomon, you would have avoided many heartaches. You couldn't seem to keep yourself from the enticements around you, and you were led into idolatry by all these foreign women. (Nehemiah 13:26 with I Kings 11:1-4)

Heavy drops of rain fell on them as they walked to cave a few yards away. A red fox cowered in the corner, but relaxed when Jesus looked into its eyes and held out his hand.

Solomon drew his garment closer as he huddled in the opposite corner. The chill had made its way to his heart. He refused to be guilt-ridden over his past indiscretions. His defenses were up, as the fox's had been.

"My actions were necessary for appearances; other kingdoms were impressed by my slaves and concubines and wives, Lord—a sign of my power and glory. I handled all of it with aplomb. I retained my wisdom, declaring: 'A fool's fun is being bad; a wise man's fun is being wise!' (Prv. 10:23, LB)."

"So you excuse the magnetic pull of your physical desire. You refuse to admit that innate sexual energy can lead to self-destruction."

"I believe I acknowledged that when I emphasized the sanctity of sexual pleasure within marriage: 'Bless your fresh-flowing fountain! Enjoy your wife you married as a young man! Lovely as an angel, beautiful as a rose—don't ever quit taking delight in her body. Never take her love for granted!' (Prv. 5:18-19)."

"Solomon, Solomon, you are like so many people down through history that so flippantly excuse their sexual appetites. I inspired one of my servants to write: 'Honor marriage, and guard the sacredness of sexual intimacy between wife and husband. God draws a firm line against casual and illicit sex' (Hebrews 13:4, Msg). And again, 'Is it a good thing to have sexual relations? Certainly—but only within a certain context. It's good for a man to have a wife, and for a woman to have a husband. Sexual drives are strong, but a marriage is strong enough to contain them and provide for a balanced and fulfilling sexual life in a world of sexual disorder' (1 Corinthians 7:1-5, Msg —excerpts). He also wrote: 'There's more to sex than skin on skin. Sex is as much spiritual mystery as physical fact. . . . we must not pursue the kind of sex that avoids commitment and intimacy, leaving us more lonely than ever—the kind of sex that can never "become one" (1 Corinthians 6:14-20, Msg —excerpts).

"This is what I intended from the beginning. But man introduced a curse on himself and perverted my plan. The consequences of sin and foolishness don't seem apparent at the moment. Fun, so-called, now; pay later. You need to admit that you succumbed to this philosophy at one time."

The rain had stopped, the claps of thunder fading into the distance. Solomon walked outside the cave, looking up as a few drops of water dripped on him from the boulder above the entrance. He would finish his journal in the coming months, and there would be fresh insights after spending time with the Great I AM.

But his admission of failure in the taking of many wives and concubines came as slowly as the dripping moisture. Jesus stepped outside, his silent presence as powerful as the storm had been.

"Lord of all Wisdom and Power, I know you see into my heart . . . and I know you speak the truth. And I must admit that I used sex and party-time to treat my despondency about the vexing and troublesome aspects of life: 'Then I decided to spend my time having fun, because I felt that there was nothing better in all the earth than that a man should eat, drink, and be merry, with the hope that this happiness would stick with him in all the hard work which God gives to man everywhere.' (Eccl. 8:15, LB)."

"And what did you conclude?" Jesus asked.

"I tempered my careless statement with a balancing one: 'Young man, it's wonderful to be young! Enjoy every minute of it! Do all you want to; take in everything, but realize that you must account to God for everything you do. So banish grief and pain, but remember that youth, with a whole life before it, can make serious mistakes. Jesus paused for a moment, giving Solomon an intense look. Then, with a tinge of sarcasm he asked, "You believed in marriage, didn't you?"



Hymns for Him

You bring the Hymnal, I'll bring the History

Based on the verse, Revelation 19:12, Matthew Bridges, in 1851, wrote the hymn, "Crown Him With Many Crowns." Bridges became a convert to Roman Catholicism at the age of 48 and then wrote this hymn, the original title of which was "The Song of the Seraphs." 30 years later Godfrey Thring wrote six more stanzas and added it to the six stanzas that Bridges had written. Each of the stanzas exalts Christ for some specific aspect of His person or ministry. In most hymnals, we find only four stanzas. Stanzas 1, 2 and 4 have been written by Bridges and number 3 by Thring.

"His eyes are like blazing fire, and on His head are many crowns . . . He is dressed in a robe dipped in blood, and His name is the Word of God." (Rev 19:12, 13)

Crown Him with many crowns, the Lamb upon His throne: Hark! how the heav'nly anthem drowns all music but its own! Awake, my soul, and sing of him who died for thee, And hail Him as thy matchless King thru all eternity.

Crown Him the Lord of love: Behold His hands and side--Rich wounds, yet visible above, in beauty glorified; No angel in the sky can fully bear that sight, But downward bends his wond'ring eye at mysteries so bright.

Crown Him the Lord of life: Who triumphed o'er the grave, Who rose victorious to the strife for those He came to save; His glories now we sing, who died and rose on high, Who died eternal life to bring and lives that death may die.

Crown Him the Lord of heav'n: One with the Father known; One with the Sprit thru Him giv'n from yonder glorious throne. To Thee be endless praise, for Thou for us hast died; Be Thou, O Lord, thru endless days adored and magnified.




