Hymns for Him

Sing songs from your heart to Christ. Sing praises over everything, any excuse for a song to God the Father in the name of our Master, Jesus Christ. ~ Ephesians 5:19-20, Msg.

In Psalm 23 the phrase "He leadeth me" is used twice. And two times in the New Testament Paul writes of the Spirit-led Christian: Romans 8:14; Galatians 5:18. Dr. Joseph H. Gilmore wrote the hymn "He Leadeth Me" in 1862, but didn't know it had been set to music by William B. Bradbury until 1865. He tells how as a young man he was a guest in the First Baptist Church in Philadelphia occasionally , and at a mid-week service was giving an exposition of Psalm 23 when the words "He leadeth me" became especially significant. It was the darkest hour of the Civil War, and that seemed to impress upon him how important God's leadership is so vital in human experience. At the close of the church meeting a deacon kept talking about this main point of the study. He said, "On a blank page I penciled the hymn, talking and writing at the same time, then handed it to my wife and thought no more about it. She sent it to *The Watchman and Reflector,* where it was first printed. I did not know until 1865 that my hymn had been set to music until I went to Rochester to preach as a candidate. I picked up a hymnal to see what they were singing, and opened it at my own hymn, "He Leadeth Me."

the Church in Galatia: "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control." (Gal 5:22-23)

Jesus, in His last precious moments with His disciples before His betrayal and crucifixion summed up God's measure of spirituality: "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:34-35)

The Holy Spirit came to Jesus quietly and softly as a dove when He arose from the baptismal waters of the Jordan. By contrast we read of the powerful and dramatic entrance of the Holy Spirit on that momentous Pentecost, fifty days after Jesus' resurrection. It came with tongues of fire, the sound of a mighty rushing wind, the gift of tongues (languages) so that all people from all nations gathered together to claim the Comforter, the Counselor, the Advocate, the "Paraclete," could know that Jesus' promise had come. Our calling is not to bear the fruit of wrangling and striving over doctrines, no matter how justified it seems. No, it is LOVE and the precious FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT by which we are identified as God's chosen. Spirit-empowered Christians can stand side by side, hand in hand in agreement and disagreement as well. Paul, learned and scholarly though he was, understood that while doctrinal purity is not within our grasp, thanks to the promise of the Holy Spirit, spirituality most certainly is.

"If anyone teaches otherwise and does not consent to wholesome words, even the words of our Lord Jesus Christ, and to the doctrine which accords with godliness, he is proud, knowing nothing, but is obsessed with disputes and arguments over words, from which come envy, strife, reviling, evil suspicions, useless wranglings of men of corrupt minds and destitute of the truth, who suppose that godliness is a means of gain. From such withdraw yourself." (1 Tim 6:3-5)

Pentecost power is not the kind of power that divides and destroys; rather it is the

kind of power that heals, comforts, revives, restores, renews, replenishes and recreates! The crucial truth is that the Spirit leads us into is the truth of love and fruit. Happy Pentecost, may the Spirit of the Lord be with you always and may you grow in grace and knowledge!
