band-wife union: 'one flesh.' (Genesis 2:24; Matthew 19:5-6) How is it possible for a proper relationship of flesh and spirit to be developed and maintained if a man desires more than one woman? (Malachi 2:14-16) Wouldn't you have been happier to develop a strong and loving relationship with the 'wife of your youth,' as you referred to it? (Proverbs 5:18, KJV)"

"Who knows what might have been? I was in love with one woman initially: the Shullamite (Song of Songs 6:13), to whom I wrote my most romantic feelings."

"And she responded in accordance with the original concept of the husband / wife relationship. I and my Father planned it that way: a glowing, romantic, happy relationship of a man and woman as one flesh, one spirit.

"Yes, Solomon, it could have been. But you departed from the original wisdom we gave you.

"What you recorded in your Manual for Living was excellent. You depicted marital love in an ambient garden setting with suggestive imagery. You wrote of the power of sexual energy with its intimacy, meant to be enjoyed exclusively by married partners."

Solomon nodded and quoted from his writings:

"'Drink from your own well, my son—be faithful and true to your wife. . . . Let your manhood be a blessing; rejoice in the wife of your youth. Let her charms and tender embrace satisfy you. Let her love alone fill you with delight.' (Prv. 5:15, 18-19, LB; see verses 1-21; 6:24-35; 9:13-18)"

"All of your advice was and is appropriate. I recognize, as you did, that it is also the wife's responsibility: 'A worthy wife is her husband's joy and crown; the other kind corrodes his strength and tears down everything he does.' How wonderfully you extolled the virtues of an ideal wife and mother, showing the exciting potential for every girl as she prepares for marriage. (Proverbs 31, entire)

"I have inspired many writings that give advice to married couples. {See Ephesians 5:21-33; 1 Peter 3:1-7; Colossians 3:18-19; 1 Corinthians 7:9, 12-14, 39. Many of these verses have been misused, twisted and misunderstood. Study carefully by comparing translations and commentaries, keeping in mind that God's original purpose was for marital fulfillment and enjoyment.} Many have simply failed to ask for my guidance in selecting a mate for life. Your words were 'House and land are handed down from parents, but a congenial spouse comes straight from God.' (Proverbs 19:14, Msg) Jesus continued:

"Good marriages should result in good families. The family unit was also an integral part of my plan for humanity."

Solomon smiled. "Ah, yes, 'Old people are distinguished by grandchildren; children take pride in their parents.' (Prv. 17:6, Msq)"

"The family unit is in place for eternity, Solomon. (See Ephesians 3:15; Romans 8:16) It goes beyond the bounds of the earthly family; as your father wrote of God the Fa-

Not everyone is mature enough to live a married life. It requires a certain aptitude and grace. — Jesus (Matt. 9:11a, Msg)

Parents rejoice when their children turn out well; wise children become proud parents. — Solomon (Prv. 23:24, Msg.)

Yesterday's discussion had left Solomon feeling empty, regretful . . . but hopeful. For the first time he understood God's exciting plan for romance and sexual fulfillment. The powerful innate forces in every human being were a part of the image of God, but were like the mighty river he and Jesus observed from their vantage point: without boundaries and channeling such could be destructive.

Jesus looked at Solomon and continued the subject of sexual urges and marriage.

- "Solomon, I gave you wisdom, but I did not give you character. That is something that seemed to elude you. To build character requires discipline: controlling one's urges and appetites. How did you fare in that part of your life?"
- "I gave clear advice about that, Master: 'For the lips of an adulteress drip honey, and her speech is smoother than oil; but the end is bitter as gall, sharp as a double-edged sword. . . . Keep to a path far from her, . . . ' (Prv. 5:3-4, 8a, NIV)
- "I must remind you that although you gave good advice you had a way of getting around it. You said of others that they would in retrospect say, 'How I hated discipline! How my heart spurned correction!' (Ibid, v. 12) Were you really talking about yourself?"

Solomon turned away, scuffing a sandal across the shale in the path. With furrowed brow, he opened his mouth to speak, closed it, and brushed a tear from his whiskered cheek.

- "I . . . I admit I wrote that from the depths of a troubled soul. What do you mean by me 'getting around' my advice to others?"
- "Think about it: you excused your lust and lack of self-control by building your harem of concubines and wives—as if that legitimized your actions. My original plan was for a hus-

Brothers and Sisters in Christ, receive greetings through our Lord Jesus Christ our hope in whom we have redemption. I regret that this is not good news. There is yet another assault on Pastor Emmanuel in Rwanda. . . . Pastor Emmanuel went back to Rwanda after a short time in another country, during this time he was engaged in studying at a Bible College. He was torn by the absence from his family and the constant visit of militia men with court summons seeking after him, this explains his return to Rwanda. . . [He] was taken before the Gacaca Court on Sabbath the 19th July 2008, He was not allowed to speak and the witnesses he brought to speak on his behalf were not allowed to speak, he was not allowed any legal representative. . . . They have scheduled another "kangaroo court" hearing for Sunday the 26th July 2008, when it is expected they will pass their verdict. . . .

Dear Jeff: Greetings in the name of Jesus! Sorry that I didn't get this information out to you but since things take a while working in Africa, I thought I should get back with the information you requested. Emmanuel is now back in exile in Uganda. He felt that the court officials were going to put him in double jeopardy and is appealing to the Supreme Court there while he is in exile. Once we have the information we need from the courts I will be sending out a request for letters on his behalf from our churches around the world. That will be in a couple of weeks or so. KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS. (Rev.19:11-16 NKJV)


